Policy Statement

The university is committed to best practices concerning student, patient and employee privacy. The university will safeguard the generation, collection, use, storage, disposal and disclosure of protected personal information.

Reason for Policy

The university has implemented measures to address privacy issues and to promote compliance with the requirements of federal law including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA), and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

Who is Governed by this Policy

Faculty, staff, students and alumni

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Policy

Information plays a critical role in the university's educational, research, patient care, administrative, and public service activities. The university recognizes the importance of safeguarding electronic and paper data that is shared within the institution and with third parties, while also preserving the free exchange of information encouraged in an academic environment.

The university has implemented measures to address privacy issues and to promote compliance with the requirements of federal privacy regulations including, but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA), and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). The Compliance & Privacy Office, in conjunction with the Division of Information Technology, the Office of the Senior Vice President and General Counsel and other offices, has developed and continues to develop policies and procedures to safeguard the generation, collection, use and disclosure of personal information at the university.

The university issued the <u>Privacy of Student Records Policy</u> to promote compliance with the educational privacy requirements in FERPA. The university issued the <u>Health Information Privacy Policy</u> to promote compliance with the privacy requirements in HIPAA. Specifically, these policies and procedures aim to protect an individual's non-public personal information. Definitions

FERPA	Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Protects the privacy of student education records
GLBA	Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act. Protects the privacy of a customer's non-public financial information.
HIPAA	Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act. Protects the privacy of individually identifiable health information.
